**Renee Hobbs, Ed.D.**, is the founder of the Temple University Media Education Lab and helps educators globally to address media literacy through research, curriculum development and advocacy. **Brian Primack, M.D.**, is internationally recognized for his research on the effect of mass media messages on adolescent health. **Jean Kilbourne, Ed.D.**, recognized worldwide for her critical studies of alcohol and tobacco advertising, will present *Deadly Persuasion: Advertising and Addiction* on March 25. Our March 26 Keynote Luncheon Speaker, **Craig LeCadre**, Senior Supervisory Special Agent with the PA Attorney General's Office, will present *Truth & Choices*, a program that shares a teen's true story of hard choices and near-death experiences due to drugs and alcohol.

The goal of the conference is to provide educators with an understanding of the core concepts of media literacy through interactive, hands-on applications such as dissecting advertisements, writing public service announcements (PSAs), and analyzing the ways companies market their products. These skills can then be implemented in the classroom or during after-school programs to teach children how to make healthy lifestyle decisions regarding substance abuse.

## Registration

The cost for the conference is \$100 per attendee. There is a full-time college student discount of \$75 per attendee. The fee covers meals and conference materials. **Registration ends March 19, 2010. To register for the conference, please use the attached registration form.**

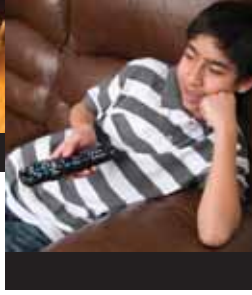
